Location

Deep Creek, approximately 105 kms (2 hours) south of Adelaide.

Outline of activity

Deep Creek Conservation Park offers some superb walking amongst rich native vegetation and plentiful fauna (a mecca for kangaroos) which also gives fantastic views over the southern ocean. We will walk about 17 kms on Saturday and 9 kms on Sunday returning to our vehicles about noon ready for a lunch at the Yankalilla Bakery.

But be warned there are some relatively steep sections.

Because the trail is easy to follow the brochure "Bushwalking in Deep Creek and Talisker Conservation Park" is adequate. For map enthusiasts, the relevant 1:50000 topographical maps are "Torrens Vale" and "Cape Jervis".

Travel: recommendations, times, car shuffling, parking etc.

Walkers may either drive down to the Stringy Park Camping Ground on Friday night or Saturday morning (depending on the weather and their inclination). Cars may be left locked in the car park at Stringy Park Camping Ground behind the Rangers Office. Walkers should allow 2 hours to travel from the Adelaide GPO to Deep Creek

Water is available at both camping grounds.

Route overview

Meeting at the Stringy Bark Camp Ground on Saturday morning, we set off via Tapanappa and, depending on rain, Boat Harbour Roads to Boat Harbour Beach where we have Elevens. Moving on via the Hysen Trail, we will lunch at the Tapanappa Lookout. Depending on the weather and the level of water in Deep Creek, we make our way to the Trig Camping Ground either by the Deep Creek Cove Hike or the Hysen Trail where we spend the night. Next morning we make our way back to Stringy Bark Camp Ground via firetracks calling in on the Waterfall if we missed it the day before.

Campsites used & possible alternatives

An entry fee of \$9 applies to each vehicle entering the park. In addition, a camping fee of about \$21 applies to camping at Stringy Bark Camping Ground and of \$12 for Trig Camp Ground.

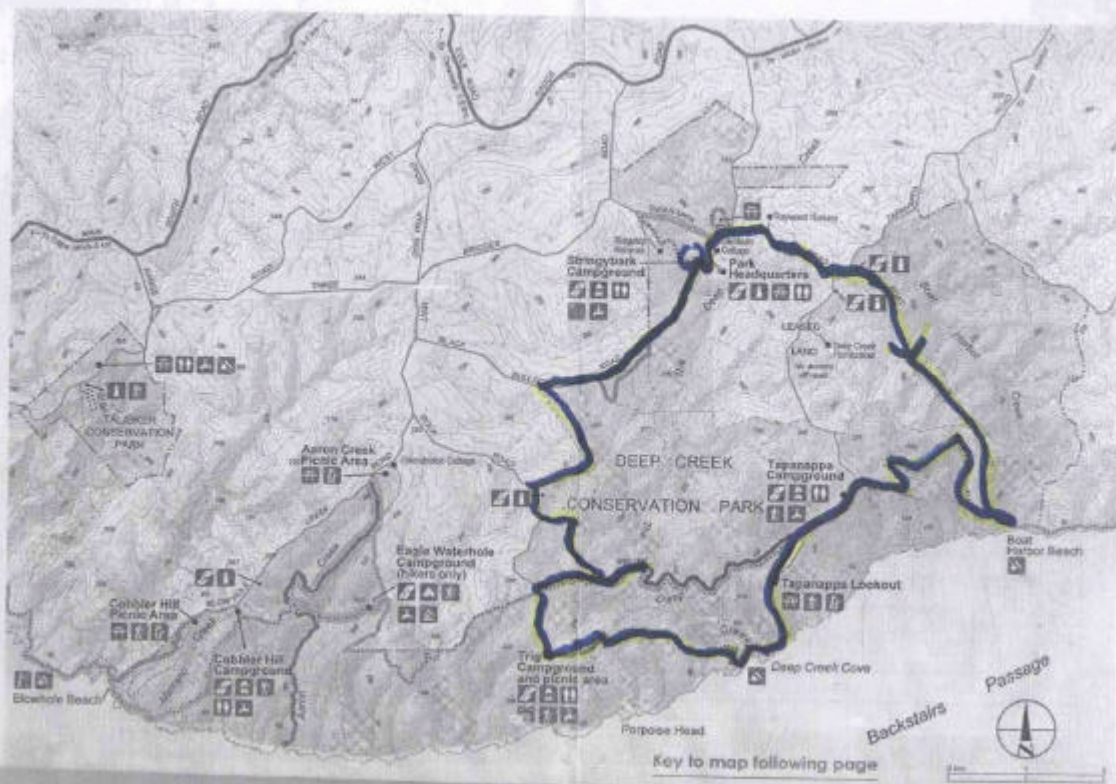
